DECLARATION OF THE SIXTH CONFERENCE

18 November 2009

The National League for Democracy (Liberated Area) held its sixth conference successfully from 15 November 2009 to 17 November 2009. The conference was attended by leaders of international branches, executive members, regional conference delegates, elected people's representatives of Burma' 1990 general election and some observers; all together 42 attendees attended.

The conference fully endorsed the National League for Democracy's Shwegondaing Declaration, and laid down decisions to call for _

- 1) Freedom of Daw Aung San Suu Kyi and all political prisoners
- 2) Convening a people's parliament with the elected people's representatives of Burma' 1990 general election
- 3) Establishing a dialogue process for national reconciliation
- 4) Revision and amendment of the 2008 constitution which was unilaterally drafted by the military regime.

Discussions were made widely on the possible outcome and consequences of new election to be held by the military regime in 2010, and future plans were laid down for preparations on our side to deal with those consequences.

To lead the National League for Democracy (Liberated Area) during the term following the sixth conference, a central committee led by Chairman U Bo Thaung (National League for Democracy's elected people's representative from Yin-Mar-Pin constituency No.1), Vice-chair Dr Aye Kyaw and Secretary U Myint Soe was elected.

The conference made the follow solemn demands to the SPDC regime:

- 1) Unconditional release as soon as possible for National League for Democracy Vice-chair U Tin Oo and General Secretary Daw Aung San Suu Kyi

- 2) As ethnic nationalities must take part in the building of a Union with national solidarity, unconditional release as soon as possible for Shan National League for Democracy Chairman Khun Tun Oo, Secretary Sai Nyunt Lwin, General Sai-Htin, U Kyaw Min from Nationalities Democratic Party and Mon ethnic leader Naing Yet-kha, who are in long-term imprisonments.
- 3) Unconditional release as soon as possible for political prisoners of conscience such as monks and holy religious leaders, elected people's representatives and democracy activists
- 4) Unconditional release as soon as possible for 88 generations student leaders, who have been imprisoned for their political conscience, such as Ko Min Ko Naing, Ko Ko Gyi, Ko Jimmie, Ko Htay Kywe, etc.
- 5) To establish a time-bound political dialogue process with an aim towards national reconciliation
- 6) To honour 1990 election results by convening a people's parliament with the elected people's representatives of that election
- 7) To create a political environment for revision and amendment of the 2008 constitution.
